Write an imaginative story about the life of a child surviving in the rainforest. <i>How did they get there? Where will they end up? What will they see? Who or what might they be afraid of?</i>	Design and make a rainforest model. Think about the plant layers e.g. forest floor and canopy.	Create your own rainforest game that will help children learn about rainforests. <i>It could be a crossword, top trumps, snap or any other game you wish to play. Don't forget to make rules!</i>
Write a diary entry describing your time hiking through the Amazon rainforest. <i>What did you see? What memories stuck with you? How were you feeling?</i>	Create your own 'Did you know?' fact cards about the Rainforest. Get the class to discover amazing facts!	Use the internet to find out what the weather is like in the Amazon Rainforest. <i>Could you record this in a table or using a graph?</i>
Make a rainforest survival guide. <i>You could include a kit list, dangerous animals to watch out for, health and safety instructions and a diagram of how to build a shelter.</i>	On a map, identify South America, Brazil and the Amazon Rainforest.	Draw or find an image of the rainforest and label the different layers. <i>The layers include the following: emergent trees, canopy, understory and forest floor.</i>
Create a word search including 10 key words you have learnt from our topic.	Create a glossary for the following key words: climate, equator, continent, rainforest, tropics, canopy, deforestation, indigenous, vegetation, understory and tropical.	Read a book and write a review. What did you like about it? What did you dislike? Would you recommend it to a friend?
