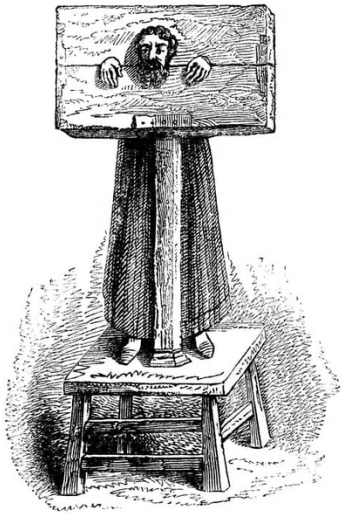


# Crime and Punishment Through the Ages
