## Where does Chocolate come from?

### KEY VOCABULARY

**Cacao Tree** - A tropical tree that grows cacao pods.

**Cacao Pod** - The fruit containing cacao beans.

**Cacao Bean** - The seed used to make chocolate.

**Climate** - Long-term weather of a place.

**Tropics** - Hot areas near the Equator.

**Equator** - Imaginary line around Earth's middle.

**Import** - Goods brought into a country.

**Export** - Goods sent out to another country.

**Fair Trade** - Helps farmers earn a fair price.


**Sustainable** - Using resources without harming the future.

**Supply Chain** - The journey a product takes from source to shop.
