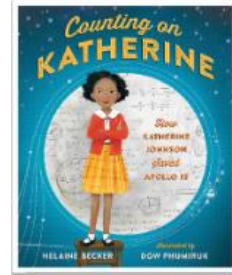
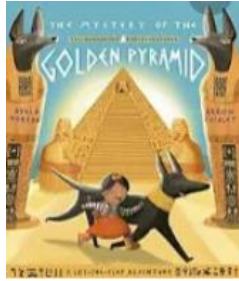
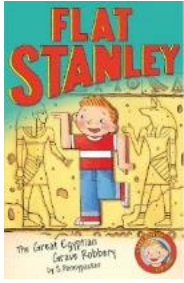

- Use multiplication and division to solve problems using equal groups, arrays and sharing.

Science - Sound

In science, we will explore how sounds are made by vibrations and how they travel to our ears. We will investigate pitch and volume, identify patterns, and discover how sounds change over distance through exciting experiments and practical investigations.

Science Vocabulary	Definition
Sound	A type of energy that we hear when something vibrates.
Vibration	A quick back-and-forth movement that makes sound.
Pitch	How high or low a sound is.
Volume	How loud or quiet a sound is.
Medium	A material that sound travels through, such as air, water or solids.

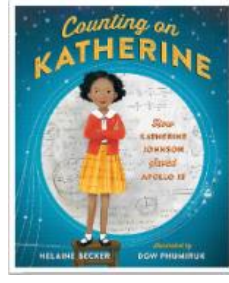
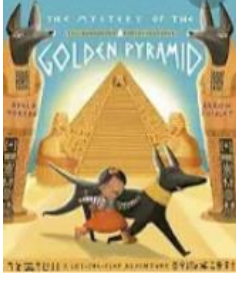
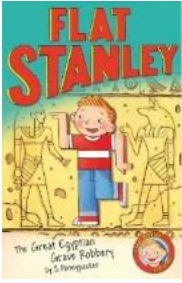
Definition

Hieroglyphics	A type of writing that used pictures and symbols.

Gods and Goddesses	Powerful beings that people in Ancient Egypt believed controlled parts of life and nature.
Afterlife	The life Ancient Egyptians believed people would have after they died.
