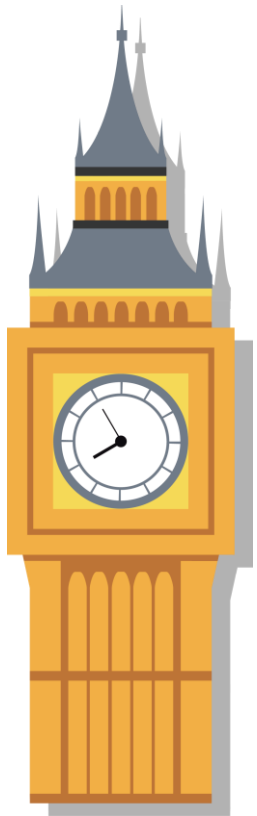
Year 5 - London Calling

<p>History: create a fact-file about The Blitz. What was it and when did it happen?</p> <p><i>Challenge: Read The Blitz by Jack Segal.</i></p>	<p>Imagine that you have just arrived in London from another country. Write a letter home describing the city to your family.</p> <p><i>Challenge: Hit your writing targets.</i></p>	<p>Imagine your friend is coming to visit London. Where would you take them and why.</p> <p><i>Challenge: Do it as a leaflet.</i></p>
