It's Yellow Class Again at the top of the league with a great 98.89% and Gold for Key Stage 2 at 98.57%. Well done to both classes. Legal Duty: Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school regularly; failing to do so can lead to fines or prosecution. Daily attendance: is crucial for academic achievement, social development, and mental health, while missing days can cause children to fall behind. Exceptions: Absences are only permitted in specific circumstances, such as illness, or if advance permission is granted by the school for exceptional circumstances, such as religious events. Persistent Absence: An attendance rate of 90% or below is considered persistent absence, which can make it hard for children to form and maintain relationships with peers. Remember, when in school, children learn, play, make friends, and discover new things every day. Its where big dreams begin and little steps get them closer every school day.
