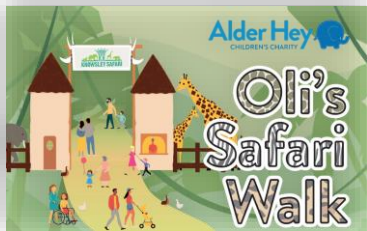

## Fostering Good Mental Health



Talking about worries, building resilience, and learning how to look after our mental health are important parts of everyday school life. These skills help children feel safe, confident, and ready to learn. We support this through daily interactions, routines, and conversations, as well as through planned, discreet lessons where children are given time and space to explore these themes in a safe and supportive environment. In our final week of this half term, we are celebrating Children's Mental Health Week. During this special week, children will explore what it means to have good mental health and, importantly, learn practical strategies to help look after their own wellbeing. Much of the learning will be based on the *Five Ways to Wellbeing*, which highlights five simple, evidence-based actions we can all take to support positive mental health. Children in KS2 will be watching a play called, 'Tangled Web' which is designed to help children explore and identify risks associated with using the internet. Through watching the characters' stories, children learn about the dangers of online use and consider ways that they can make their own internet use safer.
