The Power of Reading

With the Book Fair being in school this week and seeing the excitement and enthusiasm of the children when they have visited it, I thought it was a good time to reflect on the importance of reading.

When children read regularly, they're not just learning how to recognise words on a page, they are increasing their **vocabulary**, improving their **spelling**, and developing a stronger understanding of how language works. This supports learning across all subjects; from understanding a maths questions to exploring science and history.

Reading stories helps children grow their own **imagination** and **creativity**. They can travel to new worlds, meet different characters, and experience situations they might never encounter in real life. This helps develop **empathy** and builds **emotional awareness**.

Reading also strengthens **concentration** and **memory**. Sitting with a book, following a storyline, and remembering details all help train the brain to focus; a skill that benefits children in every area of learning.

Most importantly, reading can just be a nice way to relax and unwind. Children who see reading as enjoyable not just 'school work' are more likely to become lifelong readers, which is what we would love all of our children to be.
